

Mukurtu User Roles Planning Activity

Digital Stewardship Curriculum

There are many user roles available for use within Mukurtu CMS to ensure that users can appropriately access and manage digital heritage items and other site elements. This activity will help you identify potential user roles for your Mukurtu CMS site.

- Using the chart below, identify three users, and mark *Yes* or *No* in the appropriate box if they should be able to perform that specific function or not.
 - Users can be either specific or general (eg: archivist, language department student intern, community member, anonymous site visitor)
- For each function that you mark *Yes*, refer to the bottom of the chart for the specific user role associated with that function.
 - User roles are not mutually exclusive. Most users will have multiple Community, Cultural Protocol, and Language Community roles across several groups, and some users will have additional site-wide roles.

In the example above, John Doe would need to be a Contributor to at least one Cultural Protocol (to create a new DH item), a member of at least one Cultural Protocol (to view DH items in a strict cultural protocol), and a Curator (to create collections).
