The Kodiak Alutiiq language is severely threatened. Today there are just 33 fluent Native Alutiiq speakers remaining in the Kodiak region, with approximately 10 speakers actively working on language revitalization.

The Naken-Natmen project is an effort to engage language learners, speakers, and linguistic researchers in language revitalization by making language archives accessible.

These three ladies are in a traditional plateau camp during a celebration. The ladies are all wearing buckskin dresses more reserved for dancing and ceremonies. Their dresses are somewhat longer in length so this tells me that they are not Cayuse, Umatilla or Walla Walla. Two of the ladies are not married in this picture, one with the beaded headband the other with the headband and one eagle feather. The lady on the end wearing two feathers in her headband would draw the conclusion she is married in my beliefs and customs. I have a strong feeling that the first lady is Virginia Beavert/Yakama. In this workshop, participants will get hands-on experience with Mukurtu CMS and Mukurtu Mobile. Participants will learn:


- 1. Basic site set up,
